COVID-19 Capacity Restrictions Adjusted Effective Monday, February 8, 2021

Yesterday, Governor Baker announced that capacity limits on most businesses will increase from 25% to 40%, effective 5:00 a.m. on Monday, February 8, 2021. You may recall that this capacity limitation had been reduced to 25% over the holidays and into the new year. Citing downward trends in COVID-19 reported cases, the Governor did not further extend the existing capacity limitation of 25%, which was already slatted to expire on Monday. Notably, though, no changes are being made to the current limitations on gatherings (10 people indoors, and 25 people outdoors). As a reminder, these gathering limits apply to private homes, event venues, and public spaces.
